Responsibilities

(Last updated 1/17/2013)

1. Faithful attendance is expected at all meetings and the Diocesan Convention, whenever and wherever held within the diocese. If more than two meetings are missed, the member should evaluate whether he or she can continue to participate in this activity.
2. Full participation in all meetings, discussions and voting is expected. Come prepared to work, having studied all materials beforehand. Carry your share of the load of the group's work.
3. Act as a representative of the diocese to the deaneries and parishes of the diocese. Keep others informed of your discussions and actions.
4. Play well with others/exercise good group skills. Be willing to listen carefully, pay attention and don't talk (or interrupt) when others are speaking. Be patient when others ask for clarity.
5. Give careful attention to personal and communal spirituality.
6. Be willing to serve (be a servant), and lead by your service.
7. Communicate and receive communications in a variety of forms, including telephonic and electronic.
